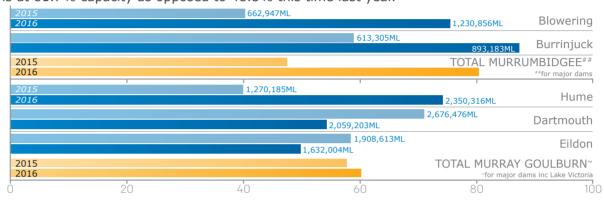

SA ALLOCATION INCREASE ON AUGUST 12

While April River Murray inflows were near lowest on record, July 2016 brought the highest inflows for 20 years. This significant rainfall improved South Australia's share of the MDB water resource. Such improvements have resulted in increased allocations for SA Murray water entitlement holders (Class 3A, 3B, 4, 7 & 8) from 89% to 100%. Full details here.

DAM STORAGE LEVELS

Water storage levels in the MDB continue to increase and are currently at 60% capacity. This is the highest level in over 19 months with much of the increase seen in the Murrumbidgee which is at 81.7% capacity as opposed to 48.5% this time last year.



RISK AND DECLARED SPILL UPDATES

VIC's share of volume held in Lake Hume has increased and the risk of spill in the Murray system is now at approximately 90%.

The risk of spill from Lake Eppalock in the Campaspe system is about 22%.

As the risk of spill in the Murray system is currently above 50%, trade from NSW to VIC is limited to the volume traded from VIC to NSW - effectively shut off, unless conditions in VIC significantly dry-out.

TRADE CLOSURES EFFECT ON PRICING

Conditions over the past month have seen a range of trading closures enacted, the major ones being downward trade of the Barmah Choke, NSW to VIC and Murrumbidgee out trade. This has reduced connectivity within the market, resulting in more fragmented pricing, as seen below.
