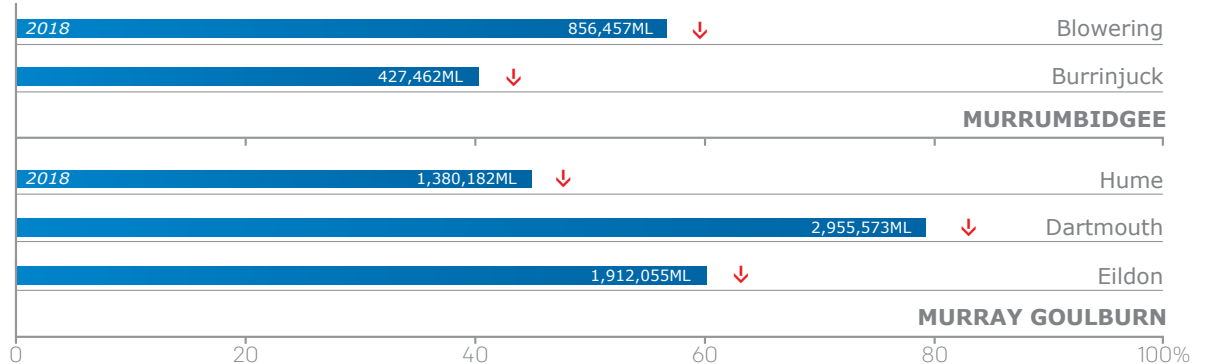

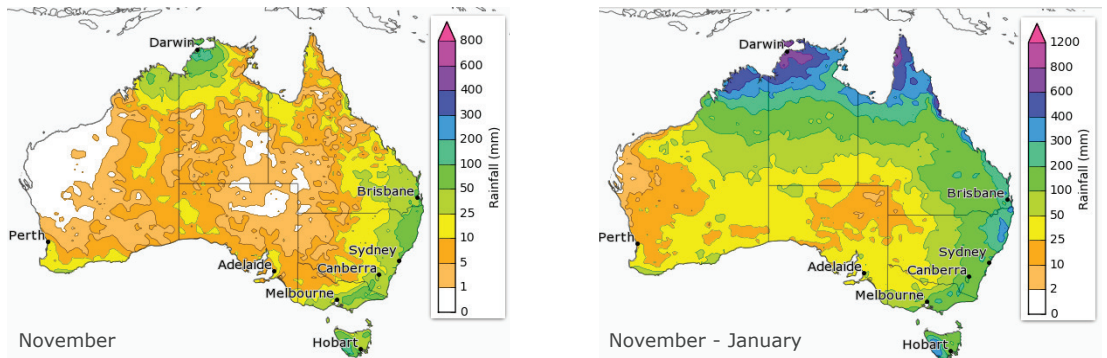
WATER TRADING RESTRICTIONS

- Murrumbidgee out-trade** is still open - capacity for 98GL to be transferred out.
- Murrumbidgee in-trade** is closed - will re-open when the Murrumbidgee IVT account balance reaches 15GL.
- Goulburn out trade** still closed as Goulburn's IVT account is still in negative balance.
- Goulburn in trade** is still open.
- The Barmah Choke** remains open - current balance allowing 62,287ML to be traded.
- Trade from NSW to VIC** is open - 200GL net trade currently allowed due risk of spill in the Murray still being below 50%.
- Lower Darling Regulated River** - Temporary trade in and out remains closed.

BOM RAINFALL OUTLOOK - 75% CHANCE OF OCCURRING NOV-JAN



November to January indicates large parts of Australia are likely to be drier than average. Northern tropics and eastern NSW have equal chance of a wetter or drier 3 months. November to January days are likely to be warmer than average for most of Australia. Many drought affected areas are not likely to see significant rain in the next 3 months.
